In Summer 2021 Japan hosted the Olympic and Paralympic Games. Top performances in sports are the focus of world attention. Unfortunately, not all these performances are achieved by legal means. Doping in sports is a salient issue that is often discussed in the news, especially during the Olympics. However, there are still many uncertainties regarding the appropriate legal response. The different approaches to self-doping serve as an example. In most countries, athletes who engage in such practices face only sanctions from their national sport organizations, in other jurisdictions such practices are defined as criminal offence and are prosecuted by specialized investigation teams. Doping rises fundamental questions in various legal fields. Because of the international nature of sports, there is great need for an in-depth comparative assessment and harmonised legal frameworks. In this Joint Workshop experts in the field of doping and sportslaw will come together to analyse the existing antidoping regulations and laws with the objective to identify strengths and shortcomings of the current legal framework and to draft model rules for national legislators.

The Joint Workshop focuses on four key topics which have been decided on the kick-off event in November. For each key topic there will be a short input presentations held by experts presenting the topic from a Japanese and Swiss perspective. The input presentations are followed by a discussion section where the plenum is encouraged to activly participate. The results of the workshop will then be published in an edited volume and will be made available in an open access format.
