Section 2

Summary of the project (approx. 200 words)

This project proposed explorative research activities in Japan and Austria to map the knowledge, practices, and policies of inclusive education. We intended to analyze the educational discourses (on an academic but also policy level) and find out the extent to which an intersectional approach is being followed in the process of tackling the education of people with various forms of what are usually referred to as "disabilities".

This project initiated a new cooperation between the Center for Teacher Education of the University of Vienna and the Graduate School of Education of Kyoto University. The Austrian context, where an intersectional approach stays limited to the intersection of disability, migration and binary gender, and the Japanese context, where an intersectional approach is relatively invisible in the educational context were compared to identify how both contexts can mutually benefit from learning from each other and add to comparative approaches in intersectional research. This project was the first cooperation between these two departments (apart from applications for individual scholarships) where graduate students were also part of the project activities and could benefit from international research cooperation.
