Since its establishment in 1877, The University of Tokyo has played a leading role both in education and academic research, with its graduates going on to become leaders in government, business, and the academic world.

The University of Tokyo offers courses in almost all academic disciplines at undergraduate and graduate levels and conducts research across the full spectrum of academic activity. The University of Tokyo's excellence in research and education has been attracting students all over the world and promoting the most active international exchange programs. Nearly 3,000 international students are currently enrolled at The University of Tokyo and this number is expected to rise each year.

Under the Global 30 project, The University of Tokyo is geared towards furthering internationalization. We offer graduate programs in a wide variety of fields completely organized in English. At the undergraduate level, the College of Arts and Sciences will launch two interdisciplinary international courses from 2012 in the fields of Japan studies in Asia, and environment and energy issues.
