HeKKSaGOn: German-Japanese University Alliance



HeKKSaGOn was established in 2010 as a unique platform for intensive research and education collaboration between six leading universities in Japan and Germany.

The European Center serves as the HeKKSaGOn liaison office, functioning as a bridge between academia in Germany and Japan.

HeKKSaGOn is named after the initials of the cities where the six member universities are located.













Key Activities

Support for Early Career Researchers (ECRs)

The European Center provides diverse forms of support to foster outstanding and internationally-minded ECRs, who are eager to address the challenges of complex global issues.

AI DA (Ambitious Intelligence Dynamic Acceleration)

AI DA is the umbrella term for several funding programs to promote the career development of highly motivated ECRs. The programs are provided through collaboration between the Kyoto University Research Administration Center (KURA),



international funding agencies, and other organizations. The European Center provides matching support for collaboration between international researchers.

DNA (Doitsu Nihon Academy) for ECRs

DNA for ECRs is a workshop for early-career researchers and students that is co-organized by Kyoto University and the German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD). Participants acquire crucial interpersonal and career-advancing skills such as efficient networking with peers from different countries and research fields.

HeKKSaGOn x L-INSIGHT Spin-Off Program

L-INSIGHT is a Kyoto University initiative that aims to develop and widely promote programs to train ECRs with global insight. In its capacity as HeKKSaGOn liaison office, the European Center supports networking between Japanese and German ECRs to facilitate collaboration on trans-disciplinary research topics.
